Year 4 – Finan for great work in the classroom and always trying his best.

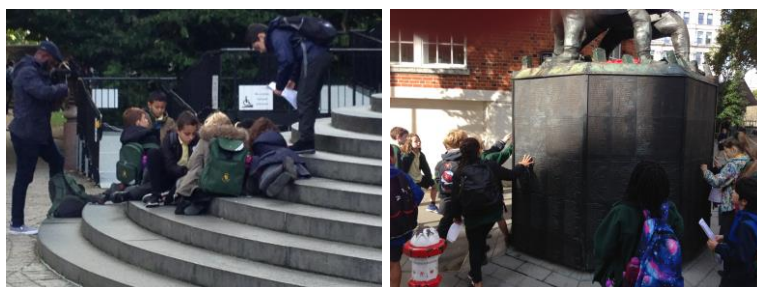
Year Cinco – Saranasrin for resilience and never giving up on her learning.
